READINGS

*Then you will go on your way in safety,
and your foot will not stumble.
When you lie down, you will not be afraid;
when you lie down, your sleep will be sweet.
Have no fear of sudden disaster
or of the ruin that overtakes the wicked,
for the Lord will be at your side
and will keep your foot from being snared.*

Proverbs 3:23-26

What, then, shall we say in response to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all – how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things? Who will bring any charge against those whom God has chosen? It is God who justifies. Who then is the one who condemns? No one. Christ Jesus who died – more than that, who was raised to life – is at the right hand of God and is also interceding for us. Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword? As it is written:

*'For your sake we face death all day long;
we are considered as sheep to be slaughtered.'*

No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Romans 8:31-39

Immediately after the fighting stopped at the end of World War 2, allied soldiers gathered up many of the refugee and orphaned children, placing them in vast tent cities. Many of the children were so badly malnourished that they needed urgent healthcare. The soldiers shared their bread and food with the children every day. However, for all the care and attention, the soldiers noticed that the children were afraid to go to sleep at night. They tried everything, from reading stories to singing songs. Nothing worked. Until one of the soldiers tried something different, he gave some of the children some bread to hold as they went to bed. The result was amazing. When they had the security of knowing they had bread for tomorrow they slept like babies.
