## REFLECTION

How observant are you about the world around you? I went up to car ark at the lighthouse at Nigg last week – it's been ages since I have been up there, overlooking the bay, I took my lunch with me and just sat and enjoyed the view and the peace and tranquillity. I see the that light house all the time, but it's a while since I actually noticed the wonder of the place.

Have you ever done than? Become so busy or so distracted that you notice the wonder of the world only out the corner of your eye; that you walk past the most amazing things without ever seeing them?

I remember a couple of years ago, the Northern Light were in full wondrous display over Stonehaven and we drove up to the car park at the top of Dunnottar Woods. We clambered out the car and stared in wonder. There was another car there, a sales rep on his way home. But he was on his mobile phone and so busy he never noticed nature's light show around him, until we went and told him, and even then, he only glanced for a moment. Imagine being too busy to notice when the sky puts on a show for you!

We have a picture at the manse, it hangs at the top of the stairs. We bought it in Canada, where I fell in love it. It's such a beautiful picture, an old sketch of the inside of a cathedral. When I hung the picture first, I would stop and look at it all the time. But now, most of the time I register that it's there, But I never stop and look anymore. The beauty has become ordinary.

I'm certain that you all can think of similar experiences and situations!

In the rush and routine of life, we miss so many of the miracles and beauty of life. And we are a bit like that with God too! We get so used to being God's people, to being a part of the church, to trusting that God is there, that we forget what an amazing thing it is to say that the creator of all the world is interested in 'me'. We get so busy with life, that we forget that we are in God's grasp; we forget the incredible comfort of knowing that God holds us in the palm of his hand.

We hear the stories from the Scriptures like the feeding of the 5000 thousand, or the resurrection, but they become commonplace. The miracles of God -these indescribable acts of wonder, these almighty statements of God's true nature - brush over us. We register them, but walk on by, allowing miracles to vanish into the background of our lives. And we lose the thrill of encountering God.

I believe in every one of our lives there are moments when God is at work revealing his will and his love. And these are holy moments, reminders we are God's beloved people. These are moments of miracle. Times when we can reflect on God's love and God's nature.

But if we are so caught up, moving through life, anxious to achieve the next task, pass the next milestone, turn up at the next meeting. Then, we are the biggest losers, because we lose the ability to see God at work.

And that really is my challenge to you this week. Amid the business and hassle of everyday day living, in the routine and in the activity of these post covid days, can you

find a place to slow down and focus on God, to rediscover God's love, God's presence in your life, and hear again God's call, find again God purpose. Can you take the time to ask yourself, 'How is God seeking to remind me of his love?', and, 'Where is God at work in my life?'
